

- Mrs. Henderson was asked to provide a Receipt Report and a detailed report of the CARES expenditures.
- Summer School/Extended Learning Fiesta – Mr. Taylor - was a great success.
 - Elementary had 57 students
 - Middle School had 48 students
 - High School had 25 students
 - For a total of 130 students in attendance
- School Calendar – Mr. Taylor presented the school calendar for 2021 – 2022. It is a traditional calendar. School will start August 2, 2021 ending on May 26, 2022.
- Counselor Update – Dr. Tarleton – All 40 seniors have been accepted into college. Twelve will be attending universities; 23 will be attending colleges; 4 will be going to technical school and 2 will enter the military. The seniors have received \$786,900 in scholarships not including 15 HOPE scholarships. Dr. Tarleton addressed each student’s career plans.
- Instruction/Special Education – Dr. Dixon – Five special education students finished up their requirements to graduate during the Fiesta. Special Education has a 100% graduation rate.
- Graduation Report – Dr. Dixon – Senior ride was fantastic. Mr. Steverson participated in the ride representing the board. He reviewed the procedures for graduation.


